At the 126th Annual meeting of the Pennsylvania Society of the Sons of the American Revolution that was held in Erie, the George Washington Chapter took home 2 of the major awards that the state society presents. The chapter received the Trimble Trophy which is awarded to the chapter with the greatest percentage increase of new members for the calendar year 2018. Of 25 chapters in the state the George Washington Chapter had 35 new members or a 42.2% increase in membership. The second state award was taking first place in the chapter activities contest. This award is broken into 3 membership categories. 50 or less, 51 to 100 and 101 or larger. The George Washington Chapter, based in Washington County is the third oldest chapter in the state. President's Remarks



Wayne Strausbaugh, President

At the PASSAR Annual Meeting on May, I was elected and sworn in as the new president of our State Society. Although I have met many compatriots over the years, I would like to reintroduce myself. I am a 22-year member of the SAR, a member of the Philadelphia-Continental Chapter and a dual member of the Continental Congress and Governor Joseph Hiester Chapters. A native of Lancaster, I am particularly proud of my Patriot ancestors and my Pennsylvania German heritage.

We should all acknowledge the debt we owe to outgoing president Ray Prusia for his fine service to PASSAR during the past twelve months. A particular milestone of his administration was the opportunity to celebrate SAR Recognition Day at the State Capitol in Harrisburg on October 15 and to have the service of our Society recognized on the floors of both the State House and the State Senate.

Twelve of our 23 active chapters were represented at our Annual Meeting through a total of 28 attendees. Our At Large Chapter was also represented - by none other than the NSSAR President General Warren Alter, a member of the Arizona Society who is a dual member in Pennsylvania. In view of the importance of the Annual Meeting, the attendance was disappointing. All of our chapters should strive to send at least one delegate to our Board of Management and Annual Meetings. Although the officers and attendees strive to make decisions that benefit compatriots living in all parts of the Commonwealth, it is difficult to accomplish this goal when many chapters are unrepresented.

There has been a consensus at our recent BOM meetings that PASSAR should endeavor to make itself better known statewide. One way of accomplishing this objective is to erect historical plaques. At the Erie BOM meeting, we authorized the erection of a plaque at the Friendship Hill National Historic Site in Point Marion (Fayette County) to commemorate the Marquis de Lafayette's triumphant return to the United States in 1824. At the suggestion of PG Alter, funds will be requested from the NSSAR George Washington Endowment Fund to supplement the PASSAR contribution. Chapters in other areas of the state may have similar projects worthy of PASSAR support that go unnoticed because of their lack of representation at our BOM meetings. Make your voices heard!

Since taking office, I have appointed Jim Hall of the Philadelphia Chapter as Chairman of the Medals and Awards Committee and Bill Aulenbacher of the Erie Chapter as Chairman of the Public Service and Heroism Committee. Please contact these compatriots if you need assistance with any matters within their respective jurisdictions. My thanks on behalf of PASSAR for the service of the retiring chairmen of these two committees, Tom Showler and Emmett Haralson, respectively.

Finally, our next Board of Management Meeting will be hosted by the Washington Crossing Chapter in Bensalem, Pennsylvania on August 2 and 3. I look forward to see many of you there!

PASSAR 2019 Spring Board of Management Meeting and Annual Meeting Highlights

The PASSAR 2019 Spring Board of Management Meeting was hosted by the Erie Chapter and held at the Clarion Hotel and Conference Center, Erie. The Compatriots who arrived and registered on Friday, May 3rd, were able to participate in a buffet dinner and fellowship at the hotel. A Pre-Board meeting was held Friday evening to discuss Treasurer concerns about rises in the cost of liability insurance, and other PASSAR financial matters.

The Board of Management (BOM) Meeting convened at 09:00 on Saturday, May 4th, with President Raynold L. Prusia in command. There were 29 compatriots present, 21 of whom had voting rights. President Prusia welcomed all in attendance. We were also honored by two distinguished guests: NASSAR President General Warren Alter; and Joseph "Joe" Schember, Mayor of Erie, PA. Mayor Schember addressed the meeting and welcomed the PASSAR to Erie.

Changes to the February 2, 2019 minutes were proposed by FP Ernest Sutton, and the minutes were tabled pending revision. Treasurer Donald Mengle followed with his report, included in the meeting booklet. He detailed the balances contained in each of the PASSAR's various accounts: Operating and Reserve. Treasurer Mengle also addressed an addendum item to Treasurer's report concerning payment of life member liability insurance for the various chapters with life members. He then explained why the liability insurance was necessary and gave various examples of what it covers.

Secretary Russell Mills announced a new process to move to electronic dues notices and called attention to the need for chapters to help keep member addresses, email addresses, and telephone numbers up to date to assure the efficient processing of dues notifications in the Fall. There are 1,667 active members as of April 18, 2019. Treasurer Mengle added that the use of electronic communications for items such as dues notices could generate savings in dues postage cost as much as 75 percent.

Registrar Eric Troutman reported that PASSAR inducted over 200 new members in 2018. A motion to accept the new members was unanimously approved. He reminded the attendees that the National SAR was in the process of introducing a new membership application. Finally, Registrar Troutman recognized the George Washington Chapter with the Trimble Trophy for greatest increase in new members is 2018. Compatriot Michael Merryman, Registrar for George Washington Chapter, received the award.

Gregory J. Shively, Chairman of the Nominating Committee, formally added Michael E. Seibert to the position of Third Vice President, Robert Grumbling for the Assistant Chaplain for West Pennsylvania, and William Hearter for Assistant Chaplain for the East Pennsylvania.

Ernest Sutton, District 8 Deputy, commented that since the submission of his report, the Somerset-Cambria Chapter changed its name to the Great Glades Chapter, effective May 4, 2019.

George M. Clarke, Jr., Chairman of the Americanism Committee offered these words of inspiration. "Planting the seed of history in the mind of youth, and planting the seed of revolution in children's minds is important. It starts something off that continues on in their life." He encouraged all chapters to actively get involved in the poster contests and brought brochures for compatriots to take back to their chapters. He also announced that the coming year's theme is the "Declaration of Independence."

Andrew L. Lick, 3rd Vice President, referred to his presentation at the Winter BOM in February on new Americanism Grants. He made a formal motion to set aside \$1,000 for four Chapter Americanism Grants to be based on the top chapter in each group on the Americanism score sheet plus an additional chapter with the fourth best overall score. Each chapter would receive a \$250 award.

The motion carried with all but one attendee in favor

Finally, Joe B. McMullen, DAR Liaison, established the time frame of April 1st to March 31st for determining recipients of the DAR Finders medals and certificates. The Spring PASSAR BOM meeting adjourned and was immediately followed by the 126th Annual PASSAR Meeting.

The Annual Meeting opened with old business. FP Sutton opened the discussion on placing a Lafayette Trail marker at the Friendship Hill Historical Site and home of Albert Gallatin. After much discussion, NSSAR President General Alter recommended we seek supplemental funding from the George Washington Endowment Fund. A motion followed by FP Sutton for PASSAR to spend \$1,400 from Reserve Funds and request \$600 from the George Washington Endowment Fund to cover the marker expenses. The motion was unanimously approved.

Under new business, William Aulenbacher, Sr., 1st Vice President of the Erie Chapter, agreed to fill the Chairman position for the Public Services and Heroism Committee. President Prusia was nominated from the floor for the Executive Committee. After receiving the Nominating Committee Report, the Compatriots approved the selection of new officers as follows:

O'Donnell, Jr., District Deputy #1; Don N. Drewry, District Deputy #2; Bruce L. Dietrich, District Deputy #3; and FP William J. McKim, Esq., District Deputy #10.

The five Executive Committee Members selected were: FP Miles K .Dechant; FP William J. McKim, Esq.; FP Lanny R. Patten; FP Ernest L. Sutton, MD; and FP Gregory J. Shively.

Finally, Michael Merryman, Registrar for George Washington Chapter, was presented a Certificate for patriot grave markings.

The 126th Annual PASSAR Meeting adjourned and a buffet lunch was served at the hotel following the meeting. Thereafter, compatriots and spouses conducted a memorial service at the Episcopal Cathedral of St. Paul, Erie, PA, beginning at 2:00 PM, honoring those PASSAR compatriots who had passed on and finished their course.

At 6:00 PM, Compatriots and invited guests attended the Annual PASSAR Banquet and swearing in of officers. Included in the activities were the oration presentation by Hattie M. Lindsey, winner of the PA Rumbaugh Essay Contest, an address from AFJROTC Cadet Major Byron Rimmer of North Penn High School, and an address from Pennsylvania C.A.R. President Emerson Sites-Byers.

The PASSAR Board of Management gives a heartfelt thanks to Erie Chapter President William Harry and all chapter members who made the Spring 2019 BOM and Annual Meeting a memorable event.

served as Secretary of the Treasury under President Thomas Jefferson and as ambassador to France and to England.

He served very briefly in the American Revolution. A table was set up and manned for two days by Joe Wingrove, Anthony Keefer, Jerry Clark, and Duane Myers. Pamphlets about SAR were made available and other information was provided to festival attendees. Much interest was show by a number of people and several signed up with the intention to pursue membership in SAR. Along with the SAR, information was available from several other lineage organizations. This was the first year that such organizations were invited to participate.

Chapter Activities - Americanism Grants

The Americanism Scoresheet is an Excel workbook designed to record the various activities that a Chapter or Society has completed during the Calendar year. It consists of 16 individual sheets or tabs plus a Cover and Summary sheet. Each of the Tabs covers one of the various functions that a Chapter or Society should be performing in support of the SAR mission. For example, one records support of the C.A.R. and DAR, others cover public service, special observances and ceremonies, youth programs, awards to both SAR and non-SAR members, etc.

In my opinion, each Chapter in the Society contributes to the SAR mission in their own way. Some might be most comfortable helping the youth by C.A.R involvement, while others want to be sure their Color Guard is present at every area parade. Often the performing of the mission takes a back seat to completing the Scoresheet.

One might say it is more fun doing the mission over recording what was done. That being the case, the Society wants more Chapters to become more involved in scoresheet completion.

To that end a program has been established which gives a grant of \$250.00 to each Chapter scoring the most points per member in their grouping (under 50 members, 51 to 100 members and over 100 members). A fourth grant was approved which would go to the next highest score no matter which size the chapter is. These grants will be awarded, along with activity streamers, at the next Annual Meeting in 2020. These funds are to be allocated for continuing Americanism activities. We hope that these Americanism Grants will further support and encourage each and every Chapter in the Pennsylvania Society submit to their Americanism Scoresheets for the good of our cause.




