Cover Story

The Columbus Chapel & Boal Mansion Museum in Boalsburg, PA (just south of State College), offers visitors a look into the past: to Colonial America, to a burgeoning economy during the early and mid-1800s, and thereafter to a growing university community.

The arrival of David Boal and his family from Ireland in 1789 marked the beginning of a long history of business, politics, education, military adventures, and multicultural endeavors in which the Boals and their remarkable relatives were involved. Some of those far-flung relatives include: Richard Henry Lee, proposer and signer of the Declaration of Independence; Napoleon Bonaparte's General James de Trobriand; Simon Bolivar, liberator of several South American countries; and Theodore Davis, who discovered the tombs of Tutankhamen's grandparents.

Christopher Columbus is certainly the most important relative visitors discover at the Boal Museum. In 1908, Colonel Terry Boal's wife, Matilde de Lagarde Boal, inherited from her aunt Victoria (widow of Diego Columbus) the contents of the Columbus family Chapel. Terry, an architect, designed a Pennsylvania limestone Chapel to match the original and installed the contents as they were arranged in the Columbus Chapel in Spain. Today you can enter the huge, carved wooden door into Renaissance Europe and learn about the remarkable paintings and sculptures, valuable furniture, rich vestments, and the two pieces of the "True Cross" owned by the Columbus and, later, the Boal families.

The Museum is open May 1—October 31, Tuesday–Sunday, 1:30–5:00 pm. Bus tours are welcome by reservation at 814-466-6210 or 814-876-0129. Museum Director Dr. Bob Cameron and our docents will be happy to provide tours: \$10 for adults, \$8 each for groups, free for active members of the military.



A spectacular example was our \$50,000 donation and a matching donation from the Lenfest Challenge Grant for a total of \$100,000 to the Museum of the American Revolution in Philadelphia, PA. 
General Arthur St. Clair Chapter Participates in Naturalization Swearing-in

Washington Crossing Chapter Re-Enact Delaware Crossing

Stephen Todderud, member of the Washington Crossing Chapter, Pennsylvania Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (red hat and standing tall in the photo) is a re-enactor in the annual recreation of Washington's crossing of the Delaware River. He portrays one of Colonel John Glover's Marblehead sailors who rowed 2,400 of George Washington's men, cannons, and horses across the Delaware River on Christmas night in 1776. Following a frigid overnight march to Trenton, the Continental Army defeated the Hessians in a battle near their barracks. This pivotal victory by Washington's army represented dramatic a turnaround from the steady series of defeats that had put the outcome of the revolution in question and precedes brilliant victories by Washington in New Jersey that drove the British back to their Northern New Jersey and New York winter quarters. The reenactment is rehearsed in mid-December and performed each Christmas afternoon at Washington Crossing State Park, involves hundreds of participants and many thousands of onlookers. Todderud recently participated for the 7th time, rowing the Durham boats containing Washington and the troops across the river.

Synopsis of Minutes, February 2017 BOM Meeting

he Winter Board of Management Meeting was hosted by the Valley Forge Chapter and was held on February 4th, 2017 at the Holiday Inn Allentown Lehigh Valley, Breinigsville, PA.

The meeting was called to order by PASSAR President, Donald E. Mengle, at 9:00 a.m.

Following approval of the minutes of the November 2016 BOM meeting, President Mengle made a few brief remarks, including that he was pleased with the attendance at BOM meetings the past year, reminders of the openings of the American Revolution Museum at Yorktown, the Museum of the American Revolution in Philadelphia, the Atlantic Middle States meeting in Gettysburg, and the PASSAR Annual Meeting on May 12th and 13th in State College.

During the Treasurer's Report, a potential shortfall in the proposed 2017 budget was discussed. Most expenses are fixed, whereas most income is fixed in that it is based on the number of members. It was noted that projected income does not include any amount for contributions.

Compatriot Lanny Patton informed the assembly that author David McCullough was presented the Sons of the American Revolution Gold Citizenship Medal at a ceremony in Washington, DC on January 2nd, 2017. He was also inducted into the Sons of the American Revolution. Ernie Sutton represented PASSAR at the ceremony.

Registrar Eric Troutman commented that it is now taking about 3 months for applications to be approved and that there were 14 approved in the last week of January.

Compatriots Patten and Joe McMullen updated the Board on the proposed movement of SAR Merchandise to the first floor of the SAR Museum. The thinking is that a gift shop in the foyer would draw people into the building before museum exhibits are complete. National has let a contract for a concept of the museum.

Americanism Chairman George Clarke announced the dates by which entries were due to him: Americanism scoresheet by February 24, brochures by April 8, and posters by May 6, 2017.

Compatriot Clarke brought to the attention of the group that the Sons of the American Revolution magazine erroneously states the 2026 National Congress will be in Philadelphia.

Following the benediction and the SAR Recessional, President Mengle adjourned the meeting at 11:45 a.m.
