Dear Compatriots,

President Lick congratulated the Liberty Medal Recipients, the Liberty Medal Oak Leaf Cluster Recipients and Public Service & Heroism Commendations. These individuals are listed on pages 104 through 107.

PASSAR Donor Breakfast Recognition: President Lick recognized Friends of the Library, SAR Education Center & Museum, Youth Award and Silver Council of State Presidents Medals/Certificates. These individuals are listed on page 107.

FP William McKim recognized the Christopher Gist Chapter for their Patriot 250 Anniversary Marker at the Butler County Courthouse (page 77).

Unfinished Business:

Ronald Miller updated the George Washington Chapter Patriot Cemetery Initiative of constructing and installing Revolutionary Patriot identification signs for selected Washington County cemeteries (58 locations).

14 signs have been installed at cemeteries. 12 signs to be installed through September (11 have been funded by donations from the DAR). An application has been submitted to the Washington County Community Foundation for a grant to complete the project county wide (32 remaining locations). Approval of the grant will enable a radio (WJPA) spot to promote our chapter activities associated with the initiative and we will develop printed brochures. Also, a joint venture with the David Bradford House Association for the summer of 2022 includes a Revolutionary War Patriot/Whiskey Rebellion History Scavenger Hunt as part of the Whiskey Rebellion Festival. This competitive organized event will allow participants to travel to the different historical cemeteries to find answers to clues from our signs with the computer interface. Signs cost \$55 each if we do assembly and installation. If we get the grant and have a restrictive timeframe the cost is approximately \$230 each for sign, assembly and installation.

FP Thomas Showler reported on PASSAR Pa license plates. Currently, cost \$28 payable to PENNDOT and \$25 payable to PASSAR. Contact him for more information. Also, find it on the Member Section on the website.

Secretary Russell Mills reports that all new member packets will include the tag.

New Business: President Lick informed the attendees of the unrestricted gift of \$44,500.00 from the Ramsey Estate. He proposes that \$40,000.00 be used for the 2024 National Congress and that \$2,500.00 be donated to the fund for a new flagpole at the Washington Crossing Historical Park that is supported by Chapter President Bill Hampton and Washington Crossing Chapter. The total cost of the project is \$16,000 and qualifies as an America 250 Event. The New Jersey Society has invited us to participate in a December 26th wreath laying ceremony in remembrance of the crossing that began the 10 crucial days to liberty. PASSAR Color Guard Units are encouraged to participate.

In accordance with our Bylaws, President Lick is requesting that a vote be taken on these recommendations at our Fall BOM Meeting.

Secretary Russell Mills reported that the dues collection for 2022 will begin soon. He has updated the membership lists and is in the process of aligning our membership with the PASSAR Database. Chapters have received these updated membership lists (XL spreadsheet) so please assist/remind your members to pay their dues. The dues notice will include a place to make a voluntary contribution to the 2024 National Congress. Also, be reminded to update your contact information. Out of 1800 members 500 do not have email addresses. Please update your email address with the Secretary. Membership information is protected.

First Vice President Michael Siebert clarified that the funding for the 2024 National Congress mailing did not come from the General Fund. That expenditure came from a separate account funded by donations for the 2024 National Congress. Treasurer Don Mengle added that the Zoom equipment was paid from an account that will be reimbursed by the Zoom participant registration fees. The equipment cost \$1,969, however, with depreciation over four years, will result in no cost to PASSAR.

Treasurer Don Mengle also reported that he is in the process of obtaining a Pennsylvania Sales Tax Exemption. There is not a guarantee that it will be granted, though. If approved, we should have it within 60 days. Chapters should be able to fall under this sales tax exemption as well. Included on pages 108-111 are the SAR Tax Letters which are provided for your information.

President Lick thanked the Great Glades Chapter for their support for the meeting. He closed the meeting and led the Recessional. The colors were retired and Robert Grumbling, Jr. gave the Benediction.
