The first portion of this report covers the Reserve. The last paragraph provides information on the Permanent Fund PASSAR.

Reserve

This report is submitted for the period March 31, 2021 through June 30, 2021. This report is being filed pursuant to Bylaw No. 8, Section 8.05-a. **Quarterly Reports.** The Meeting is being hosted on August 6 & 7, 2021 by the Great Glades Chapter.

As of June 30, 2021 the Reserve total was \$168,000.06. Of this amount \$7,397.48 was held in the Wells Fargo brokerage account in cash. In addition, \$1,059.07 was held in the Citizens Bank checking account in cash. The total of cash in both accounts in the amount of \$8,456.55 was available for transfer to the PASSAR General Operating Account, if needed. The remaining funds, the non-cash items, in the Wells Fargo brokerage account are invested in various equities, bonds and mutual funds.

In addition to the above investments, PASSAR maintained, until the end of December, cash in a restricted Citizen's Bank account that was dedicated to the support of the Museum of the American Revolution pursuant to PASSAR's pledge to donate a total of \$50,000 in increments of \$10,000 per year over five years. To date five installments of \$10,000 each have been made on PASSAR's five year pledge. The first \$10,000 was paid by a Citizens Bank counter-check dated September 2, 2016. The second \$10,000 installment was paid by PASSAR's Citizens Bank check dated September 1, 2017. The third \$10,000 installment was paid by PASSAR's Citizens Bank check dated September 12, 2018. The fourth \$10,000 installment was paid by PASSAR's Citizen Bank check dated November 4, 2019. The fifth and last \$10,000 installment was paid by Citizens Bank's Official Check dated December 23, 2020.

The following is a summary of the Reserve maintained in the Wells Fargo Advisors and Citizens Bank Accounts commencing as of January 1, 2018.

Permanent Fund PASSAR

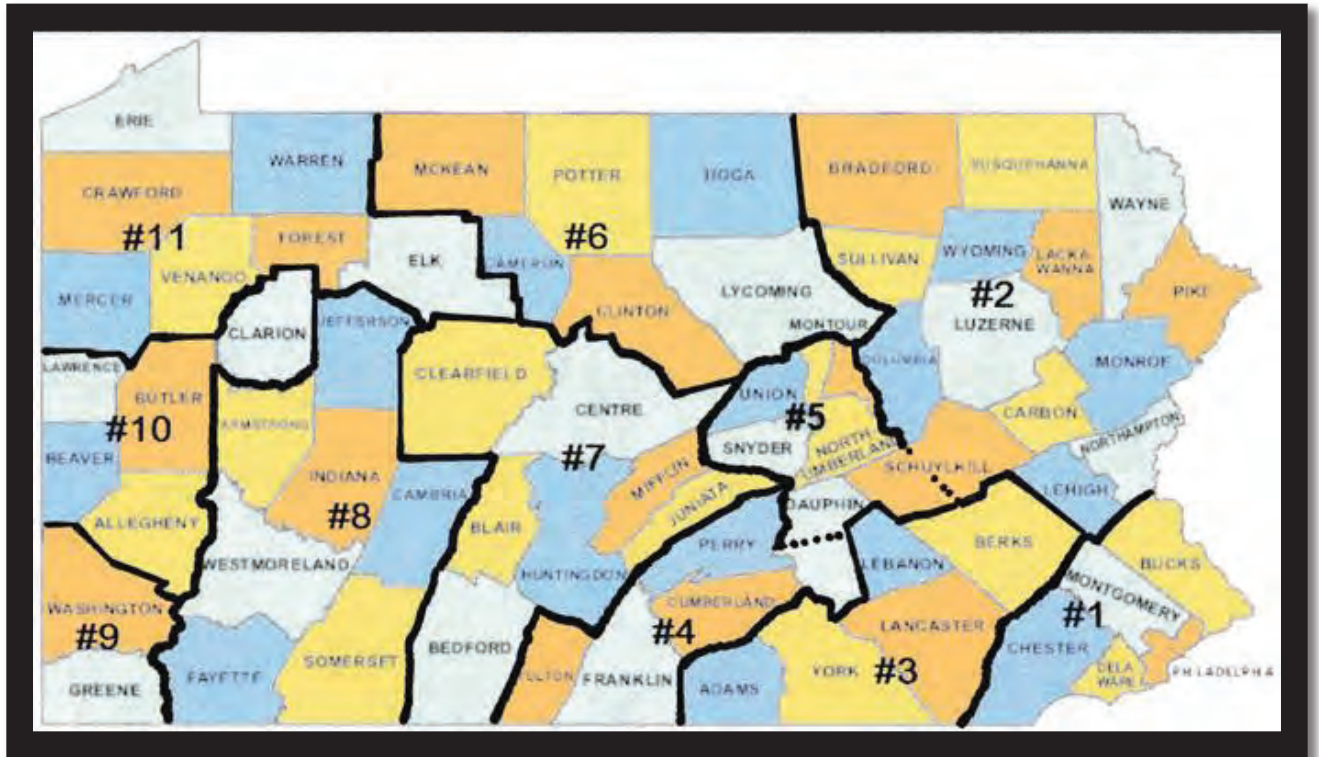

District #1 Washington Crossing Chapter Report submitted by Chapter President Bill Hampton

April: Sent out an informational update to our chapter email list, and reached out to many members via personal emails or phone calls.

May: Presented the SAR Law Enforcement Medal and Military Service Medal to new SAR member Daniel Fox at a small ceremony in the auditorium of the Washington Crossing Historic Park (pic attached). Awards presented by me and Bob Reiser who is chapter vice president. Held a Zoom-based “chapter leadership team” meeting on 11 May (meeting summary attached).

June: Co-hosted a Zoom-based author presentation with the Princeton/Cranbury Chapter of the NJSSAR. This event featured Patrick K. O'Donnell, author of “THE INDISPENSABLES: The Diverse Soldier-Mariners Who Shaped the Country, Formed the Navy, and Rowed Washington Across the Delaware” and Donald Grady Shomette, author of “PRIVATEERS OF THE REVOLUTION: War on the New Jersey Coast, 1775-1783”. This is particularly relevant because Patrick O'Donnell wrote his book based on a personal visit to Washington Crossing a few years ago, and the book highlights the actions at Washington Crossing.

Minutes from the Tuesday May 11th Washington Crossing Chapter Business Meeting

Two main agenda items were covered. The first was to continue our discussion regarding how we spend our \$800-900 annual chapter income. The chapter has about \$8,000 in savings. The second was to “greenlight” a bit about chapter activities for the rest of the year.

1. Chapter income *discussion points*:

- a. All expenditures need to support our chapter and SAR mandates. A great summary of these mandates can be found on our chapter webpage: <https://sar-wc.com/>
- b. Our chapter dinners do not negatively impact our annual budget. We've only paid for one speaker in recent years. The cost of the awards for the usual three speakers per year has been minimal.
- c. Try to find a good balance between the three categories of expenditures; awards/items for: non-SAR members, SAR members, and items applicable to either of the first two mentioned categories. A Word document list of possible awards/items with a color coding scheme to distinguish between the 3 categories is available to our chapter members. If you would like this document, please let us know.
- d. Gordon Todderud, Chapter Second Vice President, mentioned that the focus on Eagle Scouts is being accomplished with little expenditure. We are not giving cash awards or medals. As our chapter Boy Scouts liaison, Gordon has been awarding the Eagle Scouts as requested an SAR certificate as printed by the SAR and personalized for them, enclosed in a blue SAR Folder. He has also been involved in many Eagle Scout Courts of Honor and this certificate is the type of recognition accorded the boys from Congressmen, Senators and other prominent leaders. On another note, there is an SAR Eagle Scout essay and scholarship contest annually and I provide a link and encourage the boys to submit for this opportunity.
- e. Frank O'Donnell, our PASSAR Second Vice President and District One deputy, mentioned that neighboring Philadelphia Continental Chapter and other PASSAR chapters are moving away from high school cash awards to seniors for various reasons. He encouraged us to think of alternative ways to influence at the high school level, but to focus on where our participation/awards are both appreciated and can give something back to SAR (recognition, tangible help in us carrying out our chapter and

national mandates regarding educating the nation's youth and educating the educators. See chapter website.)

f. Recognizing police/firefighters/EMTs ("American heroes") is a critical function that provides much needed honor for those daily "standing in the gap" on our behalf.

g. Officially recognizing our chapter veterans, and those who serve veterans is of patriotic importance. One other powerful focus is officially recognizing organizations who have conspicuously displayed the American Flag.

h. Recognizing our fellow Chapter Compatriots for faithful service in leadership is critical in maintaining good "esprit de corps" and in encouraging others to take on leadership roles.

i. We should "streamline" gifts and awards to guest speakers as much as possible, avoiding multiple types of awards.

j. Minimize the use of framing certificates.

k. Several chapter officers mentioned that they contribute funds personally towards specific awards and items in order to reduce overall Chapter expenditures.

l. We need to look for ways to strengthen our partnering and recognition of all three Bucks County DAR chapters.

2. Chapter events for 2021 discussion points:

a. Speaker event (via Zoom) is scheduled for 8 June at 7 pm. This event sponsored by Roger Williams and his Princeton/Cranbury SAR Chapter features Patrick K. O'Donnell, author of "THE INDISPENSABLES: The Diverse Soldier-Mariners Who Shaped the Country, Formed the Navy, and Rowed Washington Across the Delaware" and Donald Grady Shomette, author of "PRIVATEERS OF THE REVOLUTION: War on the New Jersey Coast, 1775-1783". This is particularly relevant because Patrick wrote this book based on his visit to Washington Crossing a few years ago and it highlights the actions at Washington Crossing.

I send you greetings from Croatia and wishes for a successful Board of Management meeting!

After a disappointing response to the 2020 Americanism/President General's Activity Streamer program, I urge each chapter to begin work on the scoresheet for 2021. The scoresheet provides an excellent guide for available activities as well as an opportunity to gain recognition for those activities.

NSSAR has revised the scoresheet for 2021 including reducing the number of tabs from 16 to 12 through consolidations and other modifications. Consequently, in order to compete for an award, a chapter must have activity in 9 of 12 category tabs for Americanism and 5 of 7 for the PG Streamer. However, I encourage each chapter to complete a scoresheet regardless of the number of categories in which a chapter engages since the scoresheet does act as a guide and record for chapter activities. Chapter size categories for competition are now designated as 1-40, 41-90, 91-150, and 151+.

In March I distributed a link for the 2021 scoresheet to all chapters. The scoresheet can also be found on the NSSAR website at the Americanism Committee page or I can e-mail the scoresheet. It would be helpful for the chapter to enter data throughout the year as activities occur. Lastly, because NSSAR cut 2 weeks off its deadline, please observe a firm deadline of February 15, 2022 (preferably sooner), to submit the 2021 scoresheet to me so that I have time to consolidate the information into PASSAR's scoresheet for national recognition. 

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE REPORT

Monday, May 10th - An Executive Committee Meeting was held via Zoom followed by a PASSAR Leadership Meeting via Zoom on Wednesday, May 19th. At those meetings, the following updates and objectives for 2021-2022 were presented:

UPDATES & OBJECTIVES:

- **Theme during Presidency** – “As SAR gentlemen we are called to preserve the founding principles of our nation”. This builds upon Reverend Felt’s emphasis on the meaning of the SAR Cross and the importance of being an SAR gentleman. Through our own words, actions and activities the SAR upholds the virtues of our founders. These are the virtues that built the greatest nation on Earth.
- **Committee Updates** – I am pleased to announce the following appointments:
 - ✓ Nominating Committee Chair – Immediate Past President David Felts
 - ✓ 2024 Congress Registration Chair – 1st Vice President Mike Seibert
 - ✓ Meetings and Credentials Chair – 2nd Vice President Frank O’Donnell
 - ✓ Membership Chair – 3rd Vice President Kurt Winter
 - ✓ District Deputy # 9 – Compatriot Ron Miller
 - ✓ District Deputy # 11 – PP Tom Showler (will serve until May 2022)
 - ✓ Friends of the Library Chair – Compatriot Gary Timmons
 - ✓ Patriot Records Chair – Compatriot Bill Baker
- **2024 Annual Congress** – We will continue the full support of Chairman George Clarke and our 2024 Congress Planning Committee. We are holding monthly Zoom Meetings with the Congress Committee, Ladies Auxillary and NSSAR Representative Paul Callanan to meet planning and fundraising goals. The hotel location and exact dates of the Congress will be chosen in August. Will take place in July of 2024. We have already raised over \$21,000 in personal pledges from our fellow Compatriots to fund the Host Society Reception. This will be a historic event. We will be in touch with Chapters over the course of this year on volunteer opportunities. An immediate need is for volunteers who can both guide and register attendees throughout the week of Congress. - **Effective Communication** - Continue effective communications between PASSAR Leadership by facilitating Zoom meetings throughout the year in addition to our regular Board of Management Meetings. We will work on increasing the accuracy of our PASSAR roster email list. We ask our Chapter Presidents and Secretaries to update their own chapter email lists and forward any updates to Secretary Rusty Mills. Chapters can send out a mass email to their members and when email addresses are returned they can follow up with a phone call to that member to verify their new email address.
- **Increased Board of Management Participation** – We will continue to increase Board of Management participation by having Zoom Conferencing capabilities at every Board of Management Meeting. PASSAR has invested in high quality Zoom Conferencing equipment. This conferencing will be facilitated by Chairman Ron Miller of the Video Committee and volunteers from host chapters when needed. Electronic meeting booklets will be distributed to attendees prior to the meeting for their review. We would like for our Chapter Presidents to attend as many Board of Management as they are able to represent their Chapters.
- **BOM Speakers from the Floor** – It has been suggested by numerous Compatriots that we use a BOM speaker format similar to that used at National Meetings. In addition to the podium microphone, an additional microphone on a stand is placed at the front of the room. When members of the Board of Management wish to speak they may rise and come to microphone and state their name, chapter and office. Similarly, officers who are seated at the head table can use the podium microphone. This format will be most helpful both for the accuracy of the meeting minutes and the production quality of the Zoom conferencing for those attending online. We will test this format out at the upcoming Summer BOM in Uniontown.
- **PASSAR Website Members Only Log In Page** – On May 10th the Executive Committee voted to implement a members only section of our PASSAR website. It is our duty to protect the security of our membership and this is the best way to effectively prevent online hackers and scammers. This is what DAR and other similar organizations have

already done to great effect. Privacy Committee Chair Michael Seibert will be working with Webmaster Carl Fletcher to implement a members only-login section on the PASSAR website for documents that contain personal information including the officer/committee chair contact list, meeting booklets, BOM registration forms, by-laws and PA Minuteman. Generic PASSAR email links will be provided on the public section of the website so that members of the general public will still be able to contact officers and committee chairs. Each PASSAR member will be able to access this Members Only section via a password. More details to come.

- **Meaning of the SAR Cross Officer Training Initiative** – This spiritual training guide is being developed by Reverend Felts and Chaplain Bob Grumbling. We strive to be SAR Gentlemen and to represent our organization well. Once this document is fully developed it will be on the PASSAR website and will be distributed to membership for their use by Reverend Felts and Chaplain Grumbling.
- **DAR Medals for Recruiting New SAR Members** – It has come to my attention that the process for awarding DAR Ladies who bring new members needs clarification and potential improvement due to the cost of these medals. A simpler and more cost-effective method may be preferable. We will review and discuss this policy at the upcoming Summer Board of Management Meeting in Uniontown and consider changes. A policy must be agreed upon and confirmed by a vote. The policy will then be distributed to the Chapter Presidents and posted on the website for ease of reference.
- **NSSAR Youth Protection Training** – National SAR has youth protection training at <https://www.sar.org/courses/youth-protection-training/>. It is of the utmost importance that we protect the children we come in contact with as well as the integrity of our own organization. PASSAR has already made a resolution that all State Officers must take this training before taking office. Training links will also be sent to Chapter Presidents and Secretaries for distribution to their membership. While it is not mandatory at the chapter level, it is encouraged. Chapter Secretaries may keep the PDF certificate of training completion on file for their members at the chapter level as we have done at the state level.
- **Member Participation and Retention** - Member Participation and Retention is a top priority. The following are “best practices” that were identified in part by Ron Miller’s Membership Survey as well as feedback we have received over the last year. I encourage our Chapter Presidents to incorporate these practices into your chapter activities:
 - ✓ Customizable Chapter New Member Orientation Handbooks
 - ✓ Rosette Ceremony for every new member
 - ✓ Have Chapter President receive and present the new member certificate at the Rosette Ceremony instead of direct mail to new member
 - ✓ Assign a personal mentor to guide each new member and invite them to join a committee
 - ✓ Personal phone calls to new members and existing membership inviting them to the next meeting or activity
 - ✓ Invite local DAR to chapter activities to boost recruitment
 - ✓ Include an invitation to spouses for lunch and dinner events
 - ✓ Hold public award ceremonies honoring local heroes especially at local government and township activities
 - ✓ Use social media such as Facebook to publicize events and reach young people

Thursday, June 24th - A draft cover letter and proposal was presented to the Executive Committee to request funds from the George Washington Endowment Distribution Committee for the Memorial Sign Project being led by the George Washington Chapter. On July 1st a final draft of the fund request was submitted by President Lick to NSSAR George Washington Endowment Distribution Committee Chair Roger Coursey for consideration.

Tuesday, July 6th – Executive Committee Zoom Meeting was held to discuss preparations for 2021 Congress in Renton and agenda items for upcoming Summer BOM in Uniontown. No motions were made or votes called.

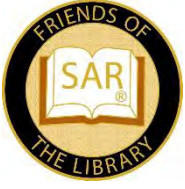

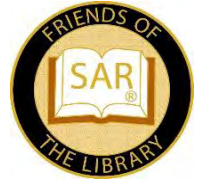

Rev Robert Grumbling and the Chairman have discussed several approaches to the material. After Bob's healing, and I no longer must care for my wife, we will meet and compare notes and begin our presentations for Officer Development. They are based on the meaning of the SAR Cross. For your information and perusal I present the following preliminary information that will begin our study. It appears on the SAR Web Page, < <https://www.sar.org/sar-missions-and-goals/>>



Our SAR's insignia is steeped in historical significance, as related in this scholarly account by Compatriot Duane L. C. M. Galles. Most SAR members are familiar with the insignia found on the membership badge of the Society of the Sons of the American Revolution. Few perhaps are familiar with the history and significance which underlie it. The insignia is not only one of the most beautiful of American hereditary societies; it is also one of the most steeped with history and replete with significance. The insignia was designed in the very early days of the Society by Major Goldsmith Bernard West, Vice-President of the Alabama SAR. The insignia consists of a cross of eight points suspended by an eagle. The cross is of white enamel and has four arms and eight points, each point being decorated with a gold head. Its source is the cross of the ancient chivalric Order of St. Louis, founded by Luis XIV in 1693.

WHY THE ORDER OF ST. LOUIS?

The cross of the Order of St. Louis is identical to the SAR cross except in three details. The central medallion of the SAR symbol bears the image of Washington rather than that of St. Louis; the medallion is surrounded by the SAR Latin motto "Libertas et Patria" or "Liberty and Country," rather than the military order's motto "Bellicae Virtutis Praemium" or "The Reward for Virtue is War;" and the angles between the arms of the cross lack the French fleur de lis. Instead, the SAR surrounds the cross with the laurel wreath of republican victory.

FRENCH AID INFLUENTIAL

Several reasons made the St. Louis cross an appropriate pattern for the SAR insignia. The Grand Master of the Order of St. Louis, Louis XVI, lent the American rebels material and diplomatic aid which was indispensable for the defeat of the British. Moreover, a great many of the French officers who fought for the American patriot cause were chevaliers of the Order. Beyond that, the Order of St. Louis had had a significant presence in North America. During the French Colonial period, somewhere around three hundred chevaliers of St. Louis saw service in on the North American continent. Hence, it was in recognition of France's decisive aid and the Order's significant presence in North America that the SAR chose the St. Louis cross as a model for its own.

But the adoption of the cross of St. Louis was appropriate for other reasons as well. The Order of St. Louis was the first order of military merit. Earlier orders, like the Order of St. John of Jerusalem and the Order of the Garter, were crusading or chivalric orders. They were open to members of the nobility ready to undertake deeds of religion or chivalry. But those deeds were international in scope: all Christendom was to be the beneficiary of the knight's good deeds. By contrast, the Order of St. Louis was established to reward military service to one's own country and it was the first to do so. Since the SAR has as its purpose the remembrance and recognition of the military service of their Revolutionary War ancestors to their country, the adoption of the St. Louis cross seemed most apropos.

LEGION OF HONOUR INFLUENCE

The laurel wreath is significant, for it is derived from another French order, the Legion of Honour. Instituted by Napoleon shortly after his advent to power, the Legion of Honour was intended to fill a vacuum left by the disappearance of the old royal orders during the Revolution. Napoleon, like Louis XIV before him, recognized the importance of rewarding faithful public service and recognizing merit. Hence, he instituted the Legion of Honour, which to this day remains one of the most prestigious orders of merit in the world. Napoleon's order however differed from the old royal orders. Those either presupposed or conferred nobility. They were inextricably linked to the caste system. But with the Legion of Honour came a new basis for reward: personal merit rather than birth. Thus, it will not be surprising that the SAR insignia is also consciously modeled on the Legion of Honour badge. The laurel wreath is borrowed from the Legion of Honour. Even the size of the SAR badge is designed to be exactly the same as the Legion of Honour's badge. But the SAR refused to follow the Legion of Honour in all respects. Unlike the five-armed Legion of Honour cross, the SAR cross resolutely retains the four arms of the cross of Christ. This is as if to declare that the excesses of deism and atheism of the French Revolution are to be eschewed by an American patriotic society; American is a nation under God.

THE EAGLE DENOTES PATRIOTISM

Also distinctly American is the eagle which suspends from the cross. Badges and insignias of European orders had used a trophy (a war helmet), a wreath, or a gold

loop to symbolize their chivalric purposes. But the purpose of the SAR was not chivalry, but patriotism. Hence, the SAR appropriately adopted the eagle which the Society of the Cincinnati had previously selected for their insignia. The SAR was conceived to mirror the Society of the Cincinnati, though open to all sons of Revolutionary sires without regard to primogeniture. All of these choices and historical influences produced a uniquely American symbol.

If desired, Celebrations can be performed as an annual event, any time for the period 2014 to 2033. Patriot gravesites can be honored with a gravesite memorial ceremony at anytime and be made a part of the American 250 SAR Award Program.

There is a SAR Patriot Sons & Daughters, 3” diameter Brass Medallion that is available from the SAR National Merchandise Department for \$15 plus \$7.5 shipping for a total of \$22.50. They currently are placing these medallions on tombstones with E6000 contact adhesive. These events should be coordinated and planned with local SAR Chapter Presidents. 
