John Proctor’s First Battalion of Westmoreland County Pennsylvania during the Revolutionary War.

Dear President Lick and Secretary Mills:

The first portion of this report covers the Reserve. The last paragraph provides information on the Permanent Fund PASSAR.

Reserve

This report is submitted for the period through March 31, 2022. This report is being filed pursuant to Bylaw No. 8, Section 8.05-a. **Quarterly Reports.** The BOM Meeting and the PASSAR Ladies Auxiliary program is being sponsored by the Governor Joseph Hiester Chapter.

As of March 31, 2022 the Reserve total was \$178,176.82. Of this amount \$4,681.90 was held in the Wells Fargo brokerage account in cash. In addition, \$1,059.16 was held in the Citizens Bank checking account in cash. The total of cash in both accounts in the amount of \$5,741.06 was available for transfer to the PASSAR General Operating Account, if needed. The remaining funds, the non-cash items, in the Wells Fargo brokerage account are invested in various equities, bonds and mutual funds.

In addition to the above investments, PASSAR maintained cash in a restricted Citizen's Bank account that was dedicated to the support of the Museum of the American Revolution pursuant to PASSAR's pledge to donate a total of \$50,000 in increments of \$10,000 per year over five years. To date five installments of \$10,000 each have been made on PASSAR's five year pledge. The first \$10,000 was paid by a Citizens Bank counter-check dated September 2, 2016. The second \$10,000 installment was paid by PASSAR's Citizens Bank check dated September 1, 2017. The third \$10,000 installment was paid by PASSAR's Citizens Bank check dated September 12, 2018. The fourth \$10,000 installment was paid by PASSAR's Citizen Bank check dated November 4, 2019. The fifth and last \$10,000 installment was paid by Citizens Bank's Official Check dated December 23, 2020.

The following is a summary of the Reserve maintained in the Wells Fargo Advisors and Citizens Bank Accounts commencing as of January 1, 2018.

Footnote 1 – On May 29, 2019, \$3,000.00 was withdrawn from the Reserve at the request of PASSAR Treasurer Donald E. Mengle with the approval of the BOM to cover the cost of supporting the PASSAR entrant in the Orator Contest.

Footnote 2 – By letter from William J. McKim dated August 5, 2019 a check in the amount of \$986.01 was deposited in the Wells Fargo Advisors Reserve Account. This amount was a reimbursement from PASSAR for that which was not spent in support of the Orator Contest of the \$3,000.00 referenced above in **Footnote 1**.

Footnote 3 – On March 10, 2020 at the request of PASSAR Treasurer Donald E. Mengle, \$408.94 was withdrawn from the PASSAR Reserve Account held by Wells Fargo Advisors with the approval of the Reserve Managers. Wells Fargo Advisors issued a check in the amount of \$408.94 made payable to PASSAR. The amount of the check was to cover 161 Life Memberships. The check was delivered by regular mail on March 15, 2020.

Footnote 4 – On March 11, 2020 at the request of PASSAR Treasurer Donald E. Mengle, \$3,137.50 was withdrawn from the PASSAR Reserve Account held by Wells Fargo Advisors with the approval of

the Reserve Managers. The check in the amount of \$3,137.50 made payable to PASSAR covered the cost of medals.

Footnote 5 – On April 8, 2020, PASSAR Treasurer Donald E. Mengle informed the Reserve Chairman that \$2,500 will be required from the Reserve to cover the cost of our supporting the Rumbaugh Oration Contest.

Footnote 6 - The fifth and last \$10,000 installment was paid by Citizens Bank’s Official Check dated December 23, 2020.

Footnote 7 – On January 29, 2021 Citizens charged a \$10 service charge for a Dormant Account Fee.

Footnote 8 – On February 26, 2021 Citizens charged a service charge of \$5 for a Dormant Account Fee.

Footnote 9- On March 31, 2021 Citizens charged a service charge of \$5 for a Dormant Account Fee. Paid for 149 Life Memberships with \$289.06 check from the Wells Fargo Account.

Permanent Fund PASSAR

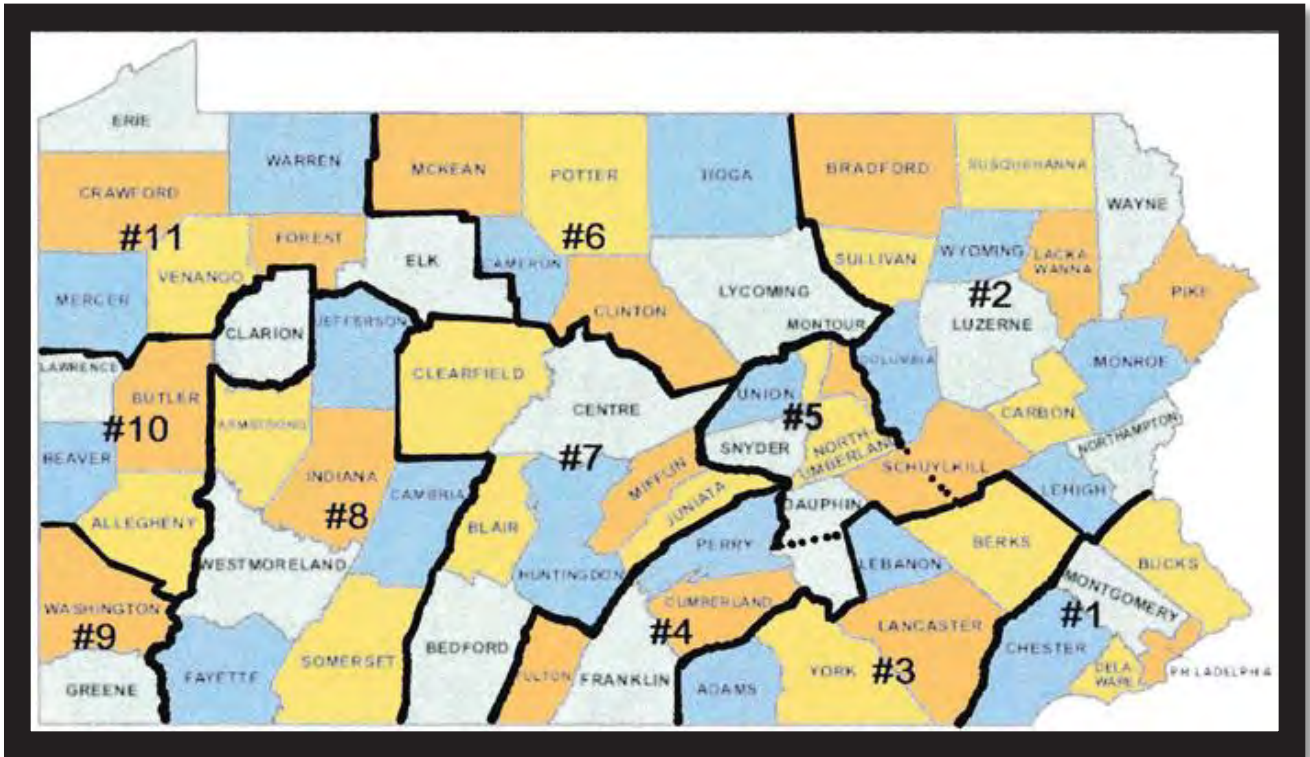

BLACK POWDER INSURANCE COVERAGE

We are working on securing insurance to cover those that carry black powder fire arms and will make that available as soon as possible.

WEARING OF COLOR GUARD UNIFORMS

Many have mentioned that they feel out of place wearing the color guard uniform at black tie events. The SAR looks upon this subject differently. If you are an SAR Color Guard member, then the uniforms should be a proud symbol of your forefather's involvement in creating these United States and that uniform then equals or exceeds modern formal attire.

BARON VON STEUBEN

Friedrich Wilhelm August Heinrich Ferdinand von Steuben transformed the Continental Army at Valley Forge. A discussion of von Steuben's 'Blue Book' that troops still follow can be found at <https://www.wearethemighty.com/mighty-culture/von-steuben-blue-book/>.

All of the standards set by the Baron still apply today. Among them is that all firearms be carries on the left shoulder. He also required that the uniform of the Continentals show rank. Shoulder boards can be used to show rank in the SAR among other things but wearing of other insignia that would show one color guardsman different than

another is inappropriate. The subject wearing medals is covered in the National Society Sons of the American Revolution COLOR GUARD HANDBOOK <https://www.sar.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/01/Color-Guard-Handbook.pdf> and can be found starting on page 12:

“Wearing Medals. If a Color Guardsman insists on wearing SAR medals on his uniform because he would not otherwise have an opportunity to wear them, then they may be worn only during SAR internal events such as chapter, state, and national meetings where the general public is not present. In any case, the Color Guard Commander in charge makes the final decision on the permission to wear medals on the Color Guard uniform during SAR internal events. It is the policy of the National Color Guard Committee that no medals or other decorations will be worn at official National Society events.”

Again, I believe we are all equal when in uniform. Some carry flags, others weapons, and some call commands. Rank might be correct to differentiate those who work hardest to put the guard together, but none is better than the others and no other outward signs should be present

CONGRESS BACKGROUND (BRIEF EXPLANATION)

The Congress is the annual meeting (Convention) of the National Society of the SAR where new national officers are elected, and awards are given. These are given to both those in the SAR and those in community, youth and adult, who have become recognized by the society for outstanding adherence to the goals and mission of the society.

The location of the Congress is bid upon by the various state societies that might want to host the event, and the idea of having the Congress in Pennsylvania on the 250th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence was considered for many years. That decision was reconsidered as it was felt that 2026 would be a very expensive, crowded time in Philadelphia. It was decided that 2024, the 250th anniversary of the Continental Congress would be a better choice and perhaps a good kick-off for the 250 celebration. The Pennsylvania society made a bid for 2024 at the fall leadership conference of 2019 and won.

The exact city in the winning state where the event is to be selected is done by a group consisting of state and national representatives. Lancaster was selected in September of 2021.

The Host state is responsible to select local trips / tours of interest, usually associated with the Revolutionary War, for the attendees. Costs for these trips is calculated by the national society representatives and charged to the attendees who elect to go on the trip / tour.

Funding for the Congress is required from the host state society to cover a host reception for all attendees and miscellaneous items like table decorations, signage, presents for the outgoing and incoming President General, etc. The state should also in some way repay the local Compatriots who put their time into organizing and running the Congress. The host state can raise funds from compatriot donations, local corporate donations, and standard fund-raising methods.

POSTERS & BROCHURES

Judging of Posters and Brochures for the 2021-2022 school year will be done at this Annual meeting thus completing this school year's contests.

The subject for the **Posters** during the 2022-2023 academic year will be a person rather than an event. I am suggesting that **each chapter** select the individual or individuals that they believe will be the best subject for their Posters in the coming school year. Whoever you select should be someone that the teacher and principal will like, one that is easy for the teacher to research and one that will give the students a deeper understanding of the Revolution.

Pennsylvania requires that all 7th grade students be instructed on the Declaration of Independence. The **brochure contest** includes other documents, but this could be all that is needed to get a school's participation in the Brochure contest. If a representative of the Chapter were to contact a middle school's history teacher with information on the contest, that could generate interest in the contest. The chapter level prize money could be as little as \$100.00 (\$50 - 1st, \$30 - 2nd and \$20 - 3rd).

It is my hope that we can get more participation in the Poster and Brochure contests, and I have tri-folded brochures for distribution to the schools in your area explaining the contests and how students can make their submissions.

One warning on either contest, the art work must be their own, nothing taken from a website, no sketches that look like someone else's work. Only their original thought and sketches; if not, their artwork will be disqualified because of copyright infringement.

PATRIOT CHEST

The Patriot Chest is a tool used by many State Societies to bring the Revolutionary War into the classroom. It uses student engagement to make the history come alive rather than the usual rote method of teaching history that mainly includes reciting names and dates.

As the 250 celebration is important to us, we believe it is appropriate that our program be officially recognized by the American250PA Committee. To accomplish that task, we would tailor the program by reducing the emphasis on the Revolutionary War and placing more emphasis on what life was like 250 years ago. To get student engagement, we would use the props from the chest to stimulate their curiosity about those times.

One of the history tools suggested by the America250PA Committee is the 100-question exam asked of new citizens applying for citizenship in the USA. Many of these would not be appropriate for our use and the introduction to the usable questions would be dependent upon the grade level of the students receiving our presentation, e.g., students of boy or girl scout age would understand the Apache or Sioux Indian nations, but 3rd grade student would probably not. (Question 87 on the test asks for the name of one Indian tribe.)

As an example, on integration of the questions into the presentation: While explaining how to make homemade soap, or the need to wear bonnets because of open cooking fires or long unwashed hair, the students would be shown how difficult life was in the colonies. A discussion of why someone would leave their homeland to come to the Colonies 250 years ago could follow. Our compatriots, dependent upon student grade level, could easily slip into a discussion of freedom of speech, religion, assembly, press or the concept of pursuit of happiness. (Question 6 is the first amendment and question 8 covers the rights found in the Declaration of Independence.)

We are working with local educators to develop a script and the viability of inserting various questions into that script. Once completed, we will present our finding to the executive committee of the Pennsylvania society and, if approved, to the America250-PA commission.

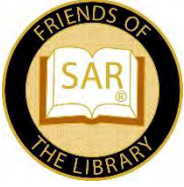

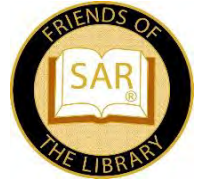

RESOLUTION

At the Fall 2020 BOM in Pittsburgh, a resolution was passed requiring all PASSAR Officers to take the online NSSAR Youth Protection Training. The following Resolution was drafted by FP Wayne Strasbaugh to solidify this requirement by inserting it into the Bylaws. The following Bylaw Resolution is being introduced at the Spring 2022 Board of Management Meeting for consideration, to be followed by a Board of Management vote at the Summer 2022 Board of Management Meeting:

RESOLVED, that the caption to Section 6.02 of the Bylaws be amended to read as follows:

Section 6.02. Duties and Reports Required of Officers; Changes in NSSAR Roster of Members; Completion of Youth Protection Program

RESOLVED, that the following two paragraphs be inserted at the end of Section 6.02 of the Bylaws:

Each Officer shall deliver to the Secretary a currently effective certificate of his completion of the NSSAR Youth Protection Training course (a "YPT Certificate") within three months after his election and, if a YPT Certificate expires before the conclusion of his term of office, no later than the expiration date of such YPT Certificate. An Officer elected prior to the Annual Meeting of the Society in 2021 whose term ends after the date of such Annual Meeting shall deliver a YPT Certificate within three months after the date of the Annual Meeting. Any Officer that fails to deliver a YPT Certificate to the Secretary within the time period specified for such delivery shall be deemed to have resigned and his position shall be filled in accordance with the provisions of Bylaw Section 6.17 (Filling Officer Vacancies).

The Board may by resolution impose similar requirements for the delivery of YPT Certificates as prerequisites for service as chairmen or members of Committees that the Board determines are likely to bring compatriots into contact with persons 18 years of age or younger.

RESOLVED, that the Society recommends that each of its Chapters adopt amendments to its bylaws requiring the completion of the NSSAR Youth Protection Training course as a prerequisite for service on Chapter committees that are likely to bring compatriots into contact with persons 18 years of age or younger.

Thus far for the June 1 2021 through May 31 2022 award year we are counting twenty(20) awards given Let us try to give several more Public Service and Heroism awards by May 31 2022. Thus far Pennsylvania has given awards in four of the five categories of Public Service and Heroism awards.

NOTE: Of the above individuals McRay Bostick and Sherwin Bostick and Joseph Paul Hopple and John Bohinc were registered as recipients of awards for the 2020-2021 year. None of the others were. The others will be counted for the 2021/2022 awards year.

The Public Service and Heroism(PS@H) Commendation booklet for the award year 2020/2021 lists the total number of PS@H awards given by each State Society, by each Chapter of the State Society, and the total numbers for each category.

NOTE Here is some information from the last annual PS@H Commendation Report concerning the PS@H awards given for year 2020/2021

During the award year 2020/2021 Pennsylvania gave 34 Public Service and Heroism awards Broken down into the five awards categories the results are 11 EMT awards, 17 Law Enforcement awards, four Life Saving awards, two fire safety awards and zero awards for Heroism.

Recognition is given to the states that have presented awards in all five categories. Since Pennsylvania did not present any Heroism awards Pennsylvania is not in this category but this coming year it hopefully will be We will be monitoring that. The five states that gave awards in all five categories were Arizona, Florida Missouri Texas and Virginia.

Pennsylvania was recognized for presenting awards in four of the five categories along with California Georgia, Indiana and North Carolina.

For purposes of information the states reporting the highest number of awards presented were Texas --46, Florida -45, Virginia-44. North Carolina matched Pennsylvania and presented 34 awards.

The NSSAR Public Service and Heroism Committee Report for a meeting held February 21 2021 lists four goals for 2021/2022 as submitted by Wayne Lambert Brown Chairman NSSAR PS@H committee

- A) Increase participation of state societies and their chapters by 10 percent.
- B) Review and update PS@H award descriptions and requirements
- C) Investigate the possibility of group recognitions
- D) Publish a booklet of PS@H commendations for 2021/2022 award recipients and make available a digital copy

When I read about or learn about in some way an event involving a person or persons who engaged in some activity that would seem to qualify for an award presentation I will contact the chapter that services the area where the event occurred.

The process of identifying persons who qualify for a Public Service and Heroism award and helping them to obtain recognition for their actions can be a very interesting and rewarding experience for them as well as for the compatriot and his chapter. Although many chapters have a person designated to coordinate possible Public Service and Heroism award candidates it is a program all chapter members can be involved in. Listening closely to the news and skimming through the newspapers you receive as well as observing your neighborhood can bring to your attention possible recipients for Public Service and Heroism awards.

On January 20 2022 I had a zoom meeting with the Philadelphia Continental Chapter President and First Vice President and Second Vice President.at which time many of the varied aspects of the NSSAR Public Service and Heroism award program were discussed. Many chapters have been actively participating in this program for several years. However if your chapter membership has some questions about this program and identifying possible awardees etc I can be available to talk with you by phone or zoom about the program.

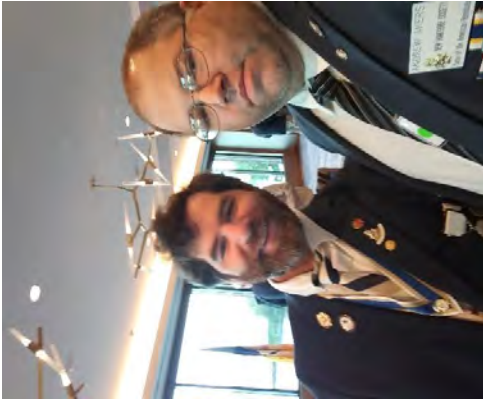

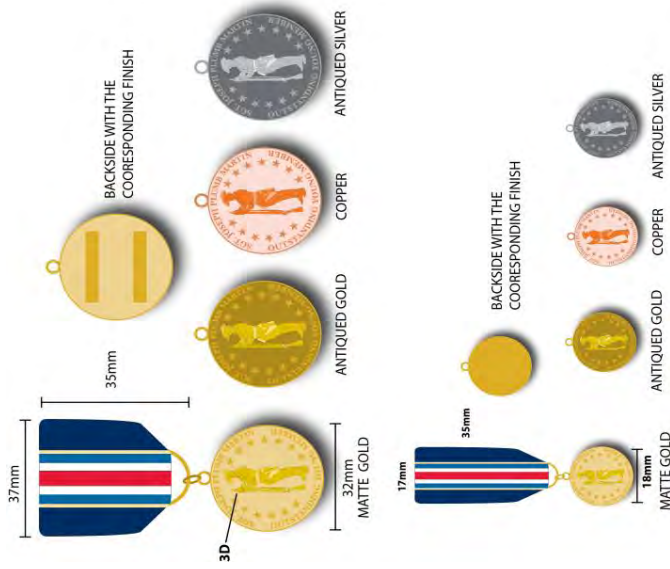

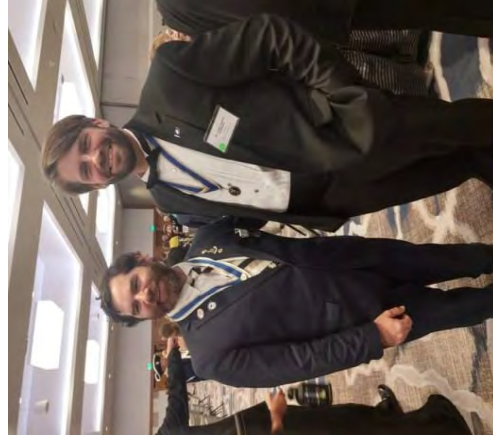

On October 7, 1763, King George III issued a Royal Proclamation that forbade Americans from moving west of the Appalachians. The King intended to organize this land, which had been recently ceded to Great Britain from France, and to stabilize relations with Native Americans. Colonial officials were forbidden to grant land west of the Appalachians without royal approval. But many Americans had already settled in the west, and viewed the Royal Proclamation as an infringement on their liberty. As the Revolution unfolded on the east coast, Americans also fought vigorously in the west. The American Revolution on the frontier illustrates the continental extent of the war and its ideology. How similar was the Revolution in the West to the Revolution in the East? How did Native Americans factor in the Anglo-American conflict? And how did the war impact settlements in the West, both during and immediately following the conflict? ***The American Revolution on the Frontier*** seeks to explore these and other questions, and to broaden our understanding of the range of the American struggle for Independence and Liberty.

Seanegan P. Sculley of the U.S. Military Academy is serving as the SAR Distinguished Scholar for this conference. ***The American Revolution on the Frontier*** shall be dedicated to Colin G. Calloway of Dartmouth College.
