The Executive Committee met on April 25, 2023. There, we made decisions about the contributions to outside organizations for Preservation and to individuals for Patriotism and Education to fulfill our mission and purpose as a nonprofit organization.

The Committee made final adjustments to the 2022-2023 year spending for youth programs.

The Committee approved \$1,000 for each of three Historic site projects: the George Washington Memorial Chapel, the Paoli Battlefield and Historic Hannahs Town. The funding will be increased in 2023 and 2024 so the projects can be meaningful to the three locations and be acknowledged and marked by appropriate plaques as a PASSAR donation.

The committee also allocated \$500 for the purchase and stocking of two traveling trunks for elementary school education about the American Revolutionary War period. The trunks will be made available to all SAR Chapters around the state for use in each chapter's territory.

Finally, the committee made final adjustments to the proposed 2023-2024 Annual budget based on additional anticipated revenue.

I submitted the 990 filing with the Internal Revenue service for the year from May 1, 2021, through April 30, 2022. The submission has been included in this meeting booklet under old business.

I was able to prepare financial statements containing financial information about PASSAR's Unrestricted, Unrestricted Designated, Temporarily Restricted, and Permanently Restricted Funds as of April 26, 2023, for use by the Annual meeting attendees. Note, the financial statements are unaudited and do not include the financial activity for the final two days in April. A complete set of financial statements for the entire year from May 1, 2022, through April 30, 2023, will be made available at the summer board of Management meeting.

I want to call attention to the changes this year in our approach to investing our funds. The table below provides a comparison of where we began in May 2022 and where we are today.

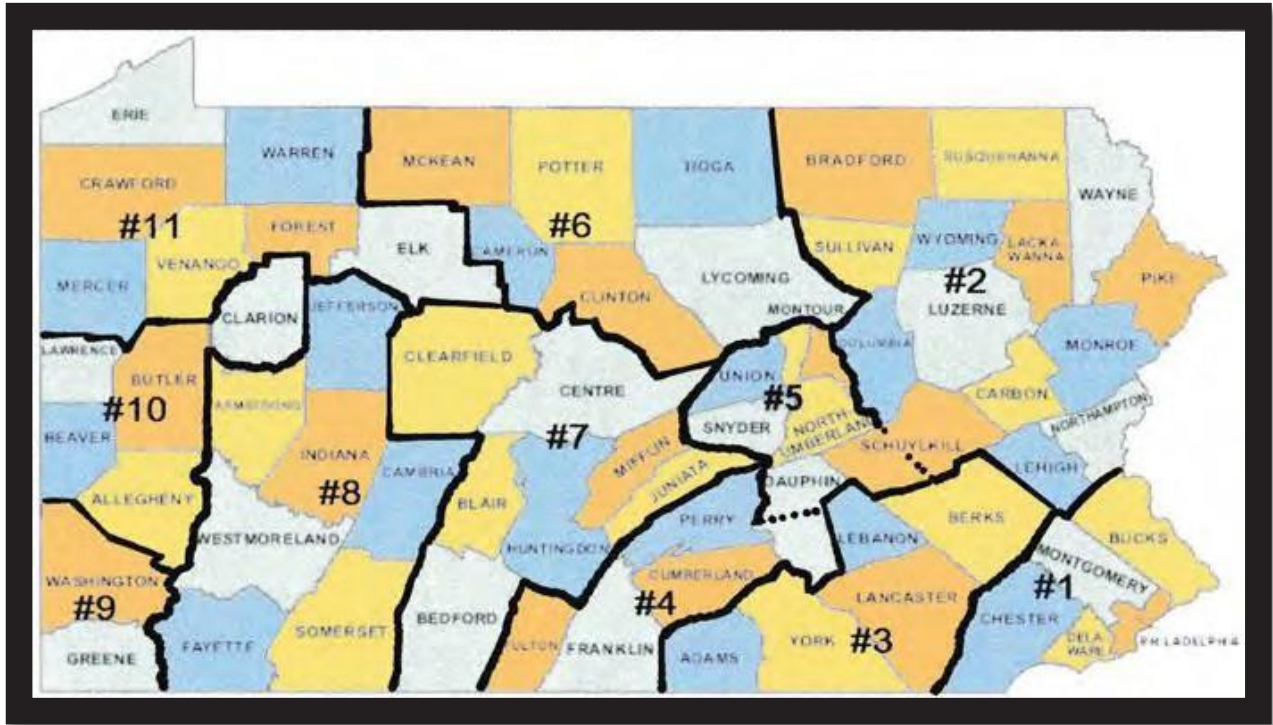

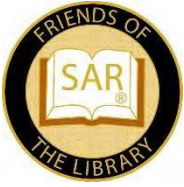

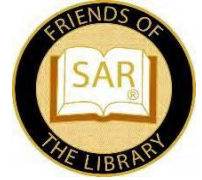

These struggling settlers, battling a vast wilderness 200 miles from Philadelphia, were forced to fend off British and Indian attacks. New Windsor Cantonment

New Windsor Cantonment State Historic Site is where the Continental Army under General George Washington spent the last winter and spring of the Revolutionary War. In October 1782, General Washington moved his northern army to New Windsor to establish winter quarters. Some 7,500 soldiers and 500 women and children civilian refugees encamped here. By late December 1782, they had erected nearly 600 log huts into a "cantonment," a military enclave. It was at the New Windsor Cantonment that the cease fire orders were issued by Washington ending the eight-year War of Independence on April 19, 1783.



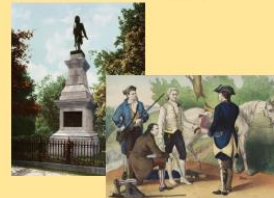
