

1863 INN OF GETTYSBURG IN GETTYSBURG, PA

The quarterly Board of Management (BOM) meeting was held on Saturday, May 6, 2023 at the 1863 Inn of Gettysburg in Gettysburg, Pa. It was hosted by the Continental Congress Chapter; President Michael E. Seibert in command. There were 41 compatriots present and 3 participated by zoom, 27 with voting privileges, a quorum was declared.

The meeting was called to order at 0900 by President Seibert. The colors were presented by the PASSAR Color Guard led by Commander Fernando Fonseca, III. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Kurt J. Winter, Esq., 2rd Vice President, followed by the singing of the National Anthem led by President Seibert. Chaplin Rev. Dr. William R. Hearter, Jr. gave the Invocation. The Pledge to the SAR was led by FP Eric H. Troutman, 1st Vice President.

There were 44 compatriots in attendance (41 in-person and 3 Zoom).





It is really a five year commitment comprised of three years serving as a vice president and then a year as president. However, after serving as President, you then serve PASSAR as the Trustee to the National SAR Organization. President Seibert further reflected on service to PASSAR as actually a life-long commitment and noted the number of past presidents in attendance at this meeting. Past Presidents stood up and were recognized.

President Seibert has been privileged to serve as President and is pleased with the goals which have been achieved and the progress made during his term.

Members were urged to attend National Congress and vote against the proposed increase of annual dues from \$35 to \$50.




The Annual meeting was called to order.





Washington Crossing Chapter report for the quarter covering April 24 2023 to July 24 2023

On Wednesday April 26 the SAR Bronze ROTC medal, certificate and a challenge coin were awarded to Outstanding cadet Sydney Busack of the Air Force Junior ROTC program at Pennsbury High School in Fairless Hills PA. Veteran award Chairman Bill Hampton processed the award package that was coordinated with the Company commander.

On Saturday April 29th a SAR application workshop was held in the auditorium of the Visitor Center of Washington Crossing Historic Park in Washington Crossing PA. Ed Elgart, chapter genealogist/registrar presented a talk to prospective members about the SAR, researching patriot ancestors and the SAR application process. The event was advertised through the chapter's website and Facebook page and Washington Crossing Park newsletter and facebook page. There were twenty people in attendance including nine persons interested in joining the SAR or helping a son apply for SAR membership.

On May 11 the SAR Bronze JROTC medal, certificate and a challenge coin were given to Cadet Sergeant Nikki LaFontano a Junior at Bensalem High School Marine Corps JROTC. She will serve as Company Executive Officer in her senior year 2023/2024. President Bob Reiser presented the award and Veteran Committee Chairman Bill Hampton processed the award package, attended the ceremony and took photos.

On Saturday May 27 three chapter members placed Betsy Ross flags on thirty one Revolutionary War veteran's graves and 17 Stars and Stripes flags on seventeen other veterans' graves at the historic Presbyterian Church of Newtown Cemetery.

On Sunday May 28 chapter members attended a Memorial Ceremony at the Revolutionary War veterans' gravesites at Washington Crossing Historic Park. Chapter member, Tim Ghebeles, played taps with the Guardians of the National Cemetery. Chapter member Micah Goldsberry played rope drum with the Washington Crossing Fife and Drum Corps. The Corps played the National Anthem and did a musical revue during the ceremony.

On Sunday June 11 the chapter held a Flag Day picnic with the Margaret Gale Thornton Chapter DAR. Picnic was held from 12 noon to 3 PM at the Moland House which was Washington's headquarters during the Battle of Brandywine in September, 1777. Shelly Young Bell of the DAR presented a ceremony developed by DAR member Rose Jones called "Flags of the American Revolution" There were thirty one people in attendance mainly DAR members and spouses.

Chapter Treasurer Ray Minich sent a Good Citizenship certificate and check to the school contact person to be presented to a graduate during awards at Penn Ridge, Palisades, and Central Bucks West High Schools.

During this past quarter Second Vice President Gordon Todderud presented three Eagle Scout recognition citations. The awardees were Andrew Featherstone, and Tyler Jones, and Nate Schwenker. Vice President Toderud has awarded four(4) certificates so far this year.

The chapter gained three new members in the first quarter. One member transferred into the chapter from the Tennessee Society during the first quarter. During the second quarter the chapter gained one new member for a total of four new members in 2023.

The cemetery is located alongside PA route 23 where they have had problems fitting the people into the small area. This year the municipality closed down PA-23 so that seating could be quickly provided in the street just outside the cemetery entrance. The ceremony took about one hour.

Jim Willis had been a member of the SAR since 1940 and served two terms as Philadelphia Continental Chapter President and served as Captain of the Chapter Color Guard for several years. For a number of years up until his death Jim Willis was the Historian for his chapter.

Membership retention was discussed along with outreach efforts to dropped members. PASSAR President Eric Troutman brought up the National dues increase which was also discussed.

PASSAR President Eric Troutman welcomed the congregation with opening remarks. After the invocation by PASSAR Chaplain Dr. William Hearter, Chapter President Peter Reinhart read the known Patriots which was followed up with the presentation of the wreath by PASSAR President Eric Troutman.

Continental Congress Chapter

May 5th - Chapter President Russell Mills presented Cadet 1LT Ronan Bigham the SAR JROTC Medal at the JROTC Warrior Battalion Banquet in the Gettysburg High School.

May 5th & 6th - The Continental Congress Chapter hosted the Pennsylvania Society's Spring Board of Management (BOM) Meeting and its 130th Annual meeting. The event was held at The 1863 Inn in Gettysburg, PA. PASSAR now-former President Michael Seibert passed the leadership baton to President Eric Troutman. The Chapter once again was awarded The Most Active Chapter plague for Medium-sized Chapters. The following Chapter members were presented awards: Joseph McMullan — State Distinguished Service Medal; Richard McGeary — Silver Roger Sherman Medal Oak Leaf Cluster; Russell Mills — Silver Roger Sherman Medal; Russell Mills — Lignian Certificate.

May 11th - Secretary Joseph Clark, participated in a Dallastown Area School District honoring of its Navy JROTC Cadets. Secretary Clark presented Nathan Macneal with a SAR JROTC Medal for his outstanding citizenship, service to the United States, and personal responsibility.

May 22nd - Members of the Continental Congress Chapter accompanied by a member of the Col. Richard McAlister Chapter, NSDAR, and a local York-based reenactor presented Michael R. Helfrich, Mayor of York City, with the Sons of the American Revolution Bronze Good Citizenship Medal at York City Hall On hand to present the award were Chapter President Russell Mills, 1st Vice President Edward Kopsick, Secretary Joseph Clark, and Historian Thomas Gibson (in Regimental attire), DAR Representative Cynthia Mills, and York-based Reenactor Valarie Connor.

May 29th - Former Chapter President Richard McGeary and Chapter President Russell Mills joined the Gettysburg Chapter, DAR, marching in the Memorial Day Parade through the town Gettysburg. President Mills was wearing his Militia Chaplain's attire during the parade-it drew quite a bit of attention.

June 3rd and June 17th - Russell Mills, dressed in Revolutionary attire, joined the Col. Richard McCalister Chapter, DAR, at their open house of the George Nace (Neas) House, in the Hanover, PA. The Colonel McCalister Chapter, with periodic appearances of Russell Mills, work in cooperation with the Hanover Area Historical Society, to bring Revolutionary and Civil War-period history alive to the public.

June 10TM - The Continental Congress held its Flag Day Board of Management Meeting and Luncheon. Compatriot John Laycock, of the Westminster, MD SAR Chapter gave an outstanding presentation on the history and travel related to Gen Anthony Wayne from York, PA to Yorktown, VA in 1781. The presentation was a primer for a Tri-State Society effort (that includes the Continental Congress Chapter) to place Historical Markers at varies locations along Anthony's original route. As well, two Chapter members received medals for their outstanding service to the community and to the Chapter: William Johns received the Bronze Roger Sherman Medal, and Thomas Gibson received the Good Citizenship Medal.

On June 15th, Russell Mills and his wife, Cynthia, joined Col. Richard McAlister Chapter Regent, Belinda Maxwell, and her husband Todd, as they visited the Dierdorff Cemetery, a forgotten and poorly maintained cemetery near East Berlin just inside York County. Many Revolutionary Veterans are buried there along with at least one War of 1812 Veteran and a Civil War Veteran. The Col. Richard McAlister Chapter and the Continental Congress Chapter have agreed to cooperatively clean up the cemetery and the grave markers and ensure these ancestors are appropriately honored throughout the year.

June 16th - Cynthia Birdwell, Regent of the Gettysburg Chapter DAR, joined Russell and Cynthia Mills to visit two cemeteries: Low Dutch South and Low Dutch North. Both cemeteries are near Gettysburg. The Continental Congress Chapter was asked to take the lead in honoring the many Revolutionary War veterans, and those of other wars, at these two small cemeteries (i.e., place flags and wreaths on the graves and conduct ceremonies). The Continental Congress Chapter reached out to the Gettysburg Chapter, DAR, offering the opportunity to cooperatively work this project.

July 12th - Russell Mills met with David Rudolph, York City Superintendent of Electrical Bureau, and Building Maintenance to pass along pictures and a blueprint of the granite SAR Bench being placed in

the front of York City Hall. Discussions included the exact placement of the bench which will be dedicated during the York Tour portion of the 2024 Congress.

July 13th - With the prompting of Compatriot Raymond Longacre, of the Gov. Joseph Hiester Chapter, President Mills ventured to the Flohr's Lutheran Church cemetery in McKnightstown to photograph the grave marker of an unmarked Revolutionary Patriot. This patriot is an ancestor of both Compatriot Longacre and Compatriot Larry Magdy, also of the Gov. Joseph Hiester Chapter. Plans are in the works for a SAR Grave Marking ceremony in August, no later than September.

July 24 - Russell Mills was the guest speaker at the Adams County Republican Club. Dressed in his Militia Chaplain's attire, Compatriot Mills provided a brief presentation on the history of the Sons of the American Revolution and shared the activities conducted at the Chapter, State and National level.

Friends of Washington Crossing Park: Title One Special Project Fundraiser

Past Chapter President Bill Hampton, had discussions with Jennifer Martin, Executive Director for The Friends of Washington Crossing Park, about an opportunity to financially support an educational program called Colonial Days for school students at the Park. Colonial Days Field Trip | Washington Crossing Historic Park (washingtoncrossingpark.org)

The Park sponsors field trips from many area and regional schools, including inner city schools, where the students are given a guided tour of Washington Crossing Park, told the history of the Crossing, and can experience what life was like in the colonial days through the Park docents and reenactors.

One of the key goals of SAR is to educate our youth about the Revolution. This is a very powerful opportunity to do this through the Washington Crossing Park school programs. The cost is very reasonable. Here are some excerpts from emails Bill received from Jennifer:

- 1) "Our field trip programs are \$11.00 per student. So, we generally say that \$275 sponsors a full field trip to the park for an entire class."
- 2) "All of the programs are hands-on, with our staff and volunteers talking about the park and how people lived in the time of Washington."
- 3) "The way our program fund works is that all funding donated to our "title one" fund is slated for programming for the year. We then work with title 1 schools to offer free or discounted programs which can even include bussing if needed. Schools then apply until the budget runs out!"
- 4) "This is a very important program as we really believe the park offers an opportunity to connect with our important history in a fun and impactful way. We often hear visitors share about their own field trips to the park as a child."

We are proposing an annual "FWCP Title One Special Project "Chapter fundraiser through which we hope to cover the cost of one class field trip per year. Title One schools have a high concentration of children from low-come families. What an awesome and cost-effective way to promote the true history of our nation's struggle for Independence for students who, sadly, may not get this chance through their schooling.

We are asking chapter members to consider making a donation to this chapter fundraiser. Our objective is to raise \$275 from our chapter members to sponsor the cost for 1 class field trip.





Paulding became famous when he along with two other soldiers, Issac Van Wart and David Williams caught the British horsemen on the Albany Post Road.

The American Friends of Lafayette (AFL) was established in 1932 with the mission to honor the entirety of Lafayette's legacy through civic engagement, education, and scholarship. The society is one of the original sponsors of the Yorktown Day Celebration held every October 19th, and since 1946, has participated in the annual July 4th ceremony at Lafayette's gravesite in Paris. Throughout 2024–2025, the AFL will host educational programming across the United States and in France to commemorate the Bicentennial of Lafayette's return to America as the "Guest of the Nation."

Our Bicentennial Committee has been established to plan and promote the recreation of many of the events related to the Farewell Tour of Major General Lafayette. The committee is made up of 200 individuals, representing the 24 states Lafayette visited in 1824-1825 (with Washington, D.C. and West Virginia included as well).

There will be hundreds of planned events, both in large cities such as New York, Boston, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Charleston, St. Louis, New Orleans, and Savannah, as well as in the multitude of small towns Lafayette visited, still brimming with pride that America's favorite fighting Frenchman came through their municipality. Our goal is to educate the public about the role played by both Lafayette and France in our war for independence with planned festivities, informative programing, and meaningful remembrances.

Beginning on August 16, 2024, we will start the thirteenmonth bicentennial celebration of Lafayette's triumphant return tour of the United States in New York City. During the next thirteen months, we will follow Lafayette's footsteps through the then existing 24 states in the exact order he traveled in 1824-1825. For example:

August 16, 2024: In New York City, we will commemorate Lafayette's return to the United States after forty years. This event will kick off our 13-month celebration.

October 17, 2024: We will gather at George Washington's tomb at Mount Vernon to commemorate Lafayette's somber visit there two centuries prior.

November 4, 2024: We will be at Monticello to honor Lafayette's visit with Thomas Jefferson.

March 4, 2025: We will be in Fayetteville, NC and rejoice with the only city Lafayette ever visited that was named after him.

April 11, 2025: We will be in New Orleans, LA.

April 29, 2025: We will be in St Louis, MO

September 8, 2025: We will end our 13-month celebration in Washington D.C. where we will board a boat to sail down the Potomac River - past Mount Vernon, just as Lafayette did 200 years earlier on his way back to France.
